
Our Mission

Benefits

Active Participation in the Arts:

Participating in the arts provides young people with a chance to explore their creativity and imagination in a structured and safe environment. Musical theatre is specifically remarkable because it is the only art form that combines all areas of the fine arts: acting, singing, dancing, music, and visual arts.

Improving Literacy Skills

From reading scripts to memorizing lines to learning to tell a story, young people continually improve their literacy skills while rehearsing and performing in a musical.

Becoming a Confident Public Speaker.

It takes a lot of guts to stand up and sing or dance in front of your family, peers, and what may seem like the entire community. Experience with public speaking at a young age gives students confidence that will be important to them for the rest of their lives.

Gaining Critical Thinking & Problem-Solving Skills:

Putting on a musical, or participating in a class, is a group effort, and every member of the team must work together to make it happen. Throughout the rehearsal/class process, the students will learn to solve challenges as they arise. Students will learn to trust and depend on themselves and their castmates.

Responsibilites

Production Management for shows:

MTVarts uses an online-based production management system, Virtual Call Board. You will receive an invitation to join. Please enter all necessary information especially email and cell phone. Check that your (or your child's) name is spelled correctly.

It is extremely important that you sign up for email and text. VCB will have the basic rehearsal schedule under calendar. Calls will be emailed for each rehearsal but things change and human error occurs so we encourage you to check VCB.

You will not be called every time there is a rehearsal. Check call details for specifics.

Attendance:

Please look over the basic calendar for rehearsals, tech week, and show dates. If there are conflicts, please enter them into VCB. If you need help, let the production team know as soon as possible.

Students are expected to attend all rehearsals they are called for unless prior approval has been given. Failure to do so can result in dismissal from the show. No conflicts are allowed for tech week or performances.

If you are unable to attend an after-school class, please contact your instructor. Contact information will be provided at first class.

Please have your child to the rehearsal/class prior to start time. *Early is on-time, on-time is late.*

Responsibilites

Rehearsals:

Rehearsals will be evenings during the week (Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays) 5:30-7:30, and Saturday mornings 9 AM-12 PM. All rehearsals will be at the Warehouse until TECH WEEK when we move into the Memorial Theater.

Students should bring their scripts, a pencil, and a snack, and they should wear appropriate shoes and clothes for movement. No flip flops or slide on shoes.

There may be some down time at rehearsals. We will have homework stations for schoolwork or quiet game playing.

Also, please make sure you have arranged for your child to be picked up on time from each rehearsal.

Attitude:

The rehearsal room and theater are safe spaces where young people can take positive risks and be themselves without the fear of being laughed at or alienated. This principle is essential to artistic growth and exploration. Participants are expected to respect these ideas and are encouraged to remember it themselves when trying new things.

Homework:

Students will have some homework for the show, including memorizing lines and songs, rehearsing their dances, researching their character, etc. Work with your child to create a schedule so they have time to finish both their school homework and their homework from the musical.

Volunteering

Teamwork:

The most important thing you can do to help us with arts education is make sure your child commits to everything listed in this handbook.
